EXECUTIVES



President (2 year term) - Dave Pauly

I have ~ 40 years of professional and personal involvement with STGR in MN. Spanning spring census and survey activities, hunter harvest bag checks, private and public lands habitat enhancement /development, and acquisitions. I am a retired MN DNR Wildlife Supervisor with a long history of being thoroughly intrigued by the 'Species Richness' of the brushland/openland environments. I am a Life Member of your MSGS and look forward to the exciting challenges the position of President will offer..

Vice President (1 year term now, then 2 year term thereafter) - Kyle Arola

I am currently Assistant Wildlife Area Manager at Thief Lake WMA. I have found that working with folks from a variety of backgrounds and experiences can greatly facilitate achieving a common goal. Many habitat management practices used in my current position are geared towards early successional species, including sharp-tailed grouse. It is rewarding, and encouraging, to see wildlife respond positively to management practices. I would be honored to serve as Vice President for MSGS and be a voice for the future of sharp-tailed





grouse.

Treasurer (2 year term) - Derek Frost

When I took the position in Aitkin as the Assistant Wildlife Manager last spring, I admit I had never had the opportunity to observe a sharp-tail on a lek prior to running our surveys. When I pulled up to the spot where the GPS said there was a lek, I found myself looking out over a plowed agricultural field. I thought I would quickly realize that there is no sharp-tailed grouse here and move on. To my surprise, I saw a flash of white in my binoculars while scanning the field and found myself mesmerized, watching the males dancing on the lek. I was amazed, and slightly amused, by how coordinated their efforts were and there stomping little feet. After what seemed like 20 minutes of watching them, I realizing I had a limited amount of time to visit my other leks that morning. I had to pry my eyes away and record 19 sharp-tailed grouse on my data sheet.

It is a memory that I will never forget, and one that will continue to excite me come April. It is a memory that I hope to share with my wife this spring, and with my 9 month old son when he becomes old enough to hold a pair of binoculars. It is with this thought that I would like to become involved with the MSGS in the hopes that there will be sharp-tailed grouse to amaze and amuse me, my family, and many more people for years to come.

Secretary (1 year term now, then 2 year term thereafter) - Martha Minchak



I am currently an Assistant Area Wildlife Manager in Duluth. I have been with the MN DNR for over 30 years, working from the prairie to the forest but mostly in brushland systems and managing for Sharp-tailed Grouse and other openlands wildlife. I am a life member of the MN Sharp-tailed Grouse Society. MSGS is the primary organization championing and giving voice to brushlands and openlands wildlife in Minnesota.

I would be honored to serve as your Secretary and to be part of the team working to maintain openlands and Sharptails on the landscape now and into the future.

REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVES

NE MN (2 year term) - Jeremy Maslowski

I hale from rural Little Falls, and currently reside on Lake Vermilion near Tower where I am one of two Assistant Area Wildlife Managers with the MN DNR. I began my education with an A.A.S. in Natural Resources Technology at Central Lakes Community College in Brainerd, continued on to the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point where to complete my B.S in Wildlife Ecology Research & Management and then receive an M.S. in Natural Resources Management from North Dakota State University.

I've done seasonal stints with Agassiz and Seney National Wildlife Refuges in Minnesota and Michigan, respectively as well as the Morris Wetland Management District, smoke chased with MN DNR Forestry in Backus Area and was a Waterfowl Technician at Mississippi State University. I also has worked for the 1854 Treaty Authority across northeastern Minnesota as a Fish and Wildlife Technician prior to joining DNR Wildlife in 2015. Among many other wildlife projects going on across my work area, I assist with managing the Sax-Zim WMA complex for sharp-tails



and many other boreal and bog bird species. In my spare time I enjoy fishing year round on Lake Vermilion, dark house spearing, snowmobiling, backpacking, and waterfowl hunting. I was first introduced to MSGS in the winter of 2006-2007 at a brush cut event while a young, shy college student and have only missed two since then while living outstate.

NW MN (1 year term now, then 2 year term thereafter) - Scott Laudenslager

I was the Assistant Wildlife manager at Norris Camp for 20 years and have been the Baudette Area Wildlife Manager for six years. Sharp tailed grouse and brushland management need help and deserve more attention.

A couple of important issues that I feel needs to be moved forward to maintain wildlife habitat and plant communities across Minnesota's landscape are private landowners gaining the desire, knowledge, skills and abilities to manage their own land with conservation groups and public agencies providing a foundation, conservation groups and public agencies continuing to work together, expansion of public land base, improvements in soil health and water quality across the agricultural landscape and monitoring both federal and state legislatures. I presently reside in

Montevideo with my wife Kathy and 9 year old black lab Nellie. My daughter is presently in a PhD. program in genetics at Iowa State in Ames.

I have been a member of MSGS for a number of years and am presently the Wildlife Manager at Lac qui Parle WMA. Lac qui Parle likely represents the southern extent of the present Sharp-tail range in Minnesota. I feel I could provide a unique perspective from this part of the birds range to the Board. Our prairie restorations efforts via tree removal, prescribed burning and prairie restorations continue to provide unexpected surprises as we open up this landscape. The information that we learn out here would be useful to the board and I feel I am in a good position to report on this region.
