

Exciting News: We received a \$500,000 Grant to Improve Habitat for Sharp-Tailed Grouse!

We are thrilled to announce that our organization has been awarded a \$500,000 Traditional Conservation Partners Legacy (CPL) grant! This is our first Traditional CPL award, and it represents a monumental step forward in our mission to enhance and restore critical sharp-tailed grouse range across Minnesota.

This grant will fund a set of transformative projects focused on enhancing eight key public land parcels in the East Central, Southwest, and Northwest regions of Minnesota. These areas are home to vital sharp-tailed grouse populations, including several lek sites that have suffered from habitat degradation due to invasive species,

encroaching brush, and forest growth. Each site was carefully selected in collaboration with Wildlife Area Managers and is part of an interconnected habitat complex essential for the species' long-term viability.

Our work will involve primarily targeted brush removal and invasive species control in known dancing grounds and adjacent habitat. Prescribed burning will also be used where appropriate to mimic historic disturbance regimes, which are essential for maintaining the open grasslands and early successional habitats that sharp-tailed grouse depend on for dancing, nesting, and foraging.

This project comes at a critical time. Sharp-tailed grouse populations in East Central Minnesota have been steadily declining, while populations in the Northwest remain strong, and the Southwest sees encouraging signs of expansion. By restoring these degraded habitats, we aim to reverse population declines, bolster genetic diversity, and support the overall health of these ecosystems.

Thank you to our members and supporters who have helped make this possible. Together, we are ensuring a brighter future for Minnesota's sharp-tailed grouse and the landscapes they call home! Stay tuned for updates as we bring this ambitious project to life.

New Wildlife Management Area Dedication

MSGS recently partnered with Pheasants Forever to complete the largest property acquisition in Minnesota Pheasants Forever history! We helped acquire a property in Lake of the Woods County that will add 1,300 acres to the Carp Swamp Wildlife Management Area which is part of an existing 14,000 acre habitat complex. This complex consists of large swaths of lowland brush that will be managed by the Minnesota DNR for the fire bird! MSGS and Pheasants Forever will be holding a



dedication event at the newly acquired property on May 3rd at 3:00 pm to mark the completion of this huge success for sharp-tailed grouse and public land hunters in Minnesota!

MSGS was honored this year by being awarded the Partnership of the Year award from Minnesota Pheasants Forever! MSGS has partnered with the habitat organization, Pheasants Forever, on numerous projects for decades. During the ceremony, Sabin Adams, MN State Coordinator and SW regional representative, highlighted the work we've done together where "we have partnered with Pheasants Forever to purchase more than a dozen WMA's covering more than 4,000 acres [...] and have restored and enhanced tens of thousands of acres of upland habitat." A lot of this work has been made possible from our work together in applying from state run grants through the Outdoor Heritage Fund and working together to complete projects in both the East-central and Northwest regions of the sharp-tailed grouse range.

The award was presented to us at the annual Minnesota Pheasants Forever State Convention in Willmar, MN on January 18th. MSGS President, Mike Chalich, and Habitat Coordinator/Honorary Director at-large, Dave Pauly, accepted the award on MSGS's behalf. Mike came back saying there was a lot of people there interested in becoming members of MSGS and gained one new life member! Two great organizations working together towards the common goal of improving habitat for grassland and prairie species in Minnesota! Overall a great event and we are very honored to receive this award and look forward to continuing to grow this partnership to do our best to help conserve sharp-tailed grouse habitat.

Member Spotlight – From our kitchen to yours!

This recipe was provided and tested by Dave Pauly, MSGS's Honorary Director at-Large and Habitat Coordinator! Recommended for Pheasant, Grouse, and turkey. Thank you Dave for sharing your recipe with us!!

Instructions:

- 1. Mix marinating sauce together in the container you want to use to marinate the meat.
- 2. Clean the bird and then spread the marinating sauce evenly on both sides of the bird
- 3. Lay ginger shreds (or wild mushrooms are great with dark meat) and green onion shreds over the bird and let marinate for 30 minutes.
- 4. Place in steamer (can use the steamer on a electric rice cooker) and steam for 20 minutes or until it is soft (can easily insert a shop stick in it).
- 5. Transfer out of the steamer and cut into chunks of whatever size you prefer.
- 6. Decorate with green onions or your choice of foraged greens (ramps, asparagus, etc.)
- 7. Serve it on a bed of wild rice, jasmine rice, cellophane noodles, or Raman noodles.

Dipping Sauce Instructions:

- 1. Heat 1 tbsp. of sesame oil in saucepan and stir fry chopped garlic and green onions until aroma.
- 2. Add in oyster sauce light soy sauce and water and mix well and bring all contents to a boil.
- 3. Transfer into a dipping bowl and let cool.

Ingredients:

Half of a whole bird (~1.5 pounds)

1tbsp. Ginger shreds

1 tbsp. Green Onion shreds (white part of the onion)

Marinating Sauce:

1 tbsp. Light Soy Sauce (Recommended brand: Lee Kum Kee)

1 tsp. Chinese Cooking Wine

1/2 tsp. Salt

Dipping Sauce:

1 tbsp. Oyster Sauce (Recommended brand: Lee Kum Kee)

1 tbsp. Light Soy Sauce

4 tbsp. water

1 Garlic clove

1 tbsp. Chopped Green Onions

1 tbsp. Sesame Oil
